Supporting care close to home in rural communities



# IMPACT MADE POSSIBLE BY YOU

Behind every dollar raised is a story of care, commitment, and community. While this year's numbers reflect remarkable generosity and growth, the true impact of philanthropy is often found in quieter moments — in the comfort families experience during a free stay at a Caring Cottage, the reassurance provided through Patient Support Funds, and the meaningful programs and services made possible across Vandalia Health.

Through donor support, moments of uncertainty are met with compassion and possibility. Contributions help patients navigate some of life's most challenging chapters, ensure families feel supported beyond clinical walls, and allow our hospitals to respond to changing needs with intention and flexibility. Each gift, no matter the size, helps move care forward and reminds patients and families that they are not alone.

Our supporters do more than contribute financially — they invest in people. Their commitment expands access to advanced care, strengthens vital services, and makes it possible to deliver support when it matters most. Quite simply, this work would not exist without those who believe in our mission and choose to stand with us year after year.

Equally appreciated are the volunteers who generously give their time, energy, and heart to our hospitals and events. From welcoming guests to supporting fundraising efforts, their dedication brings our initiatives to life and extends our reach beyond what financial resources alone can achieve. Together, donors and volunteers form the foundation of our success — a powerful reminder that philanthropy is measured not only in dollars, but in a shared commitment to caring for one another.

## AND THEN THERE WERE TWO **THE CARING COTTAGES**

The Caring Cottages at Vandalia Health Mon Medical Center were created to provide patients and families with a safe, comfortable, home-like place to stay when traveling to Morgantown for medical care. Located on the edge of the Mon Medical Center campus, the cottages help ease the emotional and financial burden of travel by offering close proximity to care in a supportive and welcoming environment.



The first Caring Cottage was completed in Fall 2025 with the second cottage joining near the end of the year, marking an important milestone in Mon Medical Center's commitment to caring for patients and families throughout the entire healthcare journey. Designed with comfort and convenience in mind, the cottages allow families to remain near loved ones during treatment, reducing stress and allowing them to focus on healing rather than logistics.

This meaningful initiative was made possible through the generosity of donors, community partners, and volunteers, with leadership support from the Mon Health Medical Center Auxiliary. Funds raised through the 2023 and 2024 Ball of the Years were instrumental in bringing the Caring Cottages from vision to reality. Together, these efforts reflect the power of philanthropy to create lasting resources that support patients, families, and compassionate care across our region.

# THE TRANSPORTATION COMFORT FUND

As a community hospital, access to transportation for non-emergency care remains one of our most significant challenges. For many patients, getting home after discharge, attending follow-up appointments, or traveling to ongoing treatments such as cancer care is difficult — and sometimes impossible — due to limited transportation options or financial barriers.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, the Transportation Comfort Fund was established in August 2024 to help bridge this gap. The fund provides patients with safe, reliable, and personalized transportation, improving access to care and easing stress during critical moments in their healthcare journey. One patient, Bruce, relied on the Transportation Comfort Fund to receive more than 60 rides to and from the Cancer Center for treatment and follow-up appointments — allowing him to focus on healing rather than logistics.

Since its creation, the Transportation Comfort Fund has supported 685 patients across a wide range of departments, including the Emergency Department, Oncology, Intensive Care, Gynecology/Oncology, Endoscopy, and Critical Care. Hospital staff have expressed relief knowing this resource is available, and its impact continues to grow. We are deeply grateful for the donor support that made this service possible and look forward to sustaining this vital program for years to come.



# THE PERSEVERING, BRAVE & JOYFUL SERIES SUPPORTING CANCER CARE PATIENTS

Made possible through donor support, the Persevering, Brave, & Joyful Series was launched as a pilot program in 2024 to provide meaningful connection, encouragement, and joy for cancer care patients and their loved ones. Now in its third series, the program continues to grow in response to overwhelmingly positive feedback from participants.

Often referred to as PB & J, the series brings patients together for thoughtfully designed sessions that combine uplifting activities, shared experiences, and practical support. Participants engage in experiences that promote emotional well-being, enjoy a shared meal, and make meaningful connections — creating a welcoming space that fosters connection beyond clinical care.

By focusing on the whole person, the Persevering, Brave, & Joyful Series reflects the power of philanthropy to support healing in ways that extend beyond treatment. Donor generosity has helped create moments of comfort, strength, and community for those navigating cancer, reinforcing that care is not only about medicine, but about compassion, resilience, and hope.



# HERE WE GROW AGAIN

***From expanding current hospitals to planting new ones, we are proud to support the growth in our Northern Region.***

Vandalia Health leadership and staff joined community members, county and city officials, and donors to celebrate a major milestone in the construction of the new Vandalia Health Mon Harrison Neighborhood Hospital at Pete Dye Golf Club during the annual DeLynn Memorial Golf Classic

The hospital is expected to be completed in 2026. With a total estimated investment of nearly \$30 million, the facility will bring advanced, accessible care to Harrison County and surrounding communities.



On December 19<sup>th</sup>, Mon Preston Memorial Hospital hosted a beam signing, marking an exciting milestone in the hospital's clinical expansion project. Staff, community members, and partners were invited to add their names and well-wishes to the final beam before it was placed. This symbolic moment celebrated growth, progress, and expanded access to care for the communities that we serve.

## THE DAVIS HOUSE

Since 2012, the Davis House has offered cancer patients a complimentary “home away from home” when it is necessary to travel to the Davis Medical Center Cancer Care Center for treatment.

Community volunteers raised funds to renovate the home and create an endowment of more than \$500,000 to provide complimentary lodging so that our patients can focus on what matters most – getting well. In 2025, we graciously hosted 62 guests, with 480 guest nights to ensure comfort and proximity for the care needed.



## JARED BOXES FOR CANCER CARE PATIENTS


## THE INAUGURAL VANDALIA HEALTH **BALL OF THE YEAR**






